



Students who are accepted into the program will at a minimum receive a Pell grant, work study award and GOS scholarship. The amount of the award will vary based on the student's need, the cost of tuition at his or her chosen school, and the amount of other financial aid the student receives. Additionally, the scholarship is renewable for up to ten semesters of continual study. During this time, students must maintain academic eligibility, be enrolled full-time, and meet their school's policy regarding satisfactory academic progress.



hen high school students are asked, "What do you want to do when you grow up?" many have a specific job or career in mind. Most also know that to achieve such goals, they will need to pursue a post-secondary education. Yet, not all students consider college a future option. Due to financial restraints, many believe attending a college or university is a dream that is out of their reach.

Started in the fall of 1999, the Governor's Opportunity Scholarship Program provides more than 250 need-based scholarships to Colorado high school students each year. Applicable at nearly 30 colleges and universities around the state, the GOS program makes attending college a possibility for us all.

Easy as One, Two, Three!

To nominate a student for a GOS award, first check to see that they meet the qualifications listed below:

- Colorado residents, who are also U\$ Citizens or Permanent Residents.
- Students who have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) or Parental Contribution of "0" according to the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) need analysis application. FAFSA applications can be completed online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- Full-time, degree-seeking freshmen with no previous post-secondary experience.
- Students who apply to and meet the requirements for admission into their chosen institution.
- Students who agree not to take out student loans while receiving the Governor's Opportunity Scholarship.

Interested students who believe they meet the GOS requirements must apply for admission to the participating college or university they wish to attend. Students can apply to more than one institution.

Next, the student must complete and submit the FAFSA "Federal Student Aid" form. All of the needed paperwork is available in the student's high school counseling office and should be submitted by the appropriate deadline or priority date.

Lastly, nominators and students must complete the Governor's Opportunity Scholarship nomination form(s). Additional nomination forms can be obtained at www.state.co.us/cche. Once properly filled in, send a nomination form to each institution to which the student is applying. Also mail a completed copy to the Colorado Commission on Higher Education.
